Born in Shanghai on January 30. His ancestral home was in Zhongshan City (Original name: Xiangshan), Guangdong province. His father Hsiao Yumei (1884-1940) was a pioneer of modern Chinese music education and founded China's first music school, the National College of Music (now renamed as Shanghai Conservatory of Music), in Shanghai, 1927.
Follows uncle Wang Hsueh-ting to move to Taiwan. Enters Taiwan Provincial Taichung Second Middle School and later transfers to Taiwan Provincial Taipei Cheng Kung High School, starts to learn woodcut printmaking.
Enters the Art Department of Taiwan Provincial Taipei Normal School (now renamed as National Taipei University of Education) under the famous woodcut printmaker Chou Ying. After school, he also studies sketching under Chu Teh- chun, beginning his artistic journey from Post-Impressionism.
Joins Li Chun-shan's (1912-1984) Antung Street Studio in Taipei through the introduction of Ho Kan, his senior, and formally commences his research on modern art.
Studies under Li Chun-shan, whose outdoor sketching classes are held in a teahouse on Sundays, and sketches frequently on street in Taipei with his classmates.
Graduates from Taiwan Provincial Taipei Normal School and starts teaching at Taipei Municipal Jingmei Elementary School.
Founds the first Chinese abstract painting group, Ton-Fan Art Group, together with Hsia Yan, Wu Hao, Li Yuan-chia, Chen Tao-ming, Hsiao Ming-hsien, Ouyang Wen-yuan, and Ho Kan in Taipei at the end of year.
Receives scholarship from the Spanish government in July and soon heads to Madrid. Upon discovering the extreme conservatism of San Fernando Royal Academy of Fine Arts (Real Academia de Bellas Artes de San Fernando), Madrid, he resolves not to matriculate there and moves to Barcelona in November.
Drops out of school once again due to the conservatism of La Lonja Superior School of Fine Arts (Escuela Superior de Bellas Artes La Lonja), Barcelona, and hence determines not to pursue schooling and gives up on the scholarship. Participates in Maillol Circle (Cercle Maillol) of French Institute of Barcelona and Royal Arts Association, where he meets some of the most active non-figurative artists of the time: A. Tapies, M. Cuixart, J. J. Tharrats, J. Subirachs, A. Saura and M. Millares. At the same time, he writes a series of news articles about the avant-garde Western art for <i>United Daily News</i> , Taipei. Presents his first ever solo exhibition at Mataro Fine Arts Museum (Museo Municipal de Mataró) in the province of Barcelona. Participates in <i>Jazz Salon</i> in Barcelona and is selected as one of the top ten outstanding painters. He also takes part in <i>May Salon</i> in Barcelona, the avant-garde countrywide exhibition at that time in Spain, for three consecutive years. Presents <i>Ton-Fan Art Group Inaugural Painting Exhibition - Chinese & Spanish Modern Artists Joint Exhibition</i> simultaneously at the Shin Sheng Daily News Building, Taipei and Jardin Gallery (Galería Jardin), Barcelona in November.

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1958	Presents a solo exhibition at Fernando Fe' Gallery (Galería Fernando Fe'), Madrid.
1959	Presents his first solo exhibition in Italy at Numero Gallery (Galleria Numero), Florence, followed by another solo exhibition at Il Cavallino Gallery (Galleria Il Cavallino), Venice. Moves to Milan later in the same year.
1960	Presents a solo exhibition at Senatore Gallery (Galerie Senatore), Stuttgart. Participates in <i>International Malerei 1960-61</i> exhibition in Eisenbach.
1961	Founds the Punto International Art Movement in Milan together with his friends, Italian artist A. Calderara and Japanese sculptor K. Azuma, on August 21. Between 1961 and 1967, he organizes thirteen Punto exhibitions in eleven countries across Europe and Asia: Milan, Barcelona, Florence, Taipei, Rotterdam, Rome, Bologna, and Zurich, bringing 26 artists from Spain, France and the Netherlands to join the movement together. Presents his first solo exhibition in Milan at Salone Annunciata Gallery (Galleria Salone Annunciata), Milan. Presents solo exhibitions at Trastevere Gallery (Galleria Trastevere), Rome, S. Matteo Gallery (Galleria S. Matteo), Genoa, HILT Gallery (Galerie HILT), Basel, and Dorekens Gallery (Galerie Dorekens), Antwerp. Participates in <i>Grand Prix de peinture et sculpture</i> in Monte Carlo and <i>The Pittsburgh International Exhibition</i> in Pittsburgh. Meets G. Marconi, with whom he develops a long-term collaboration.
1962	Marries Italian painter Pia Pizzo. Presents a solo exhibition at S. Luca Gallery (Galleria S. Luca), Rome.
1963	Signs a three-year contract with the prominent International Gallery of Contemporary Art (Galerie Internationale d'Art Contemporain), Paris owned by Belgian art dealer M. D'Arquian through the introduction of G. Marconi. Participates in <i>The 7th São Paulo Art Biennial</i> in São Paulo, <i>Art Contemporain</i> at Great Palace (Grand Palais), Paris, and <i>Chinesische Künstler der Gegenwart</i> at Municipal Museum (Städtisches Museum), Leverkusen.
1964	Works in Paris for three months and presents solo exhibitions at International Gallery of Contemporary Art (Galerie Internationale d'Art Contemporain), Paris and Ariete Gallery (Galleria dell'Ariete), Milan. Participates in <i>III° premio Scipione nazionale di pittura</i> in Macerata and <i>International Triennial of Colored Graphic</i> <i>Prints</i> in Grenchen.
1965	Presents a solo exhibition at Maribor Museum (Muzej Maribor), Maribor. Participates in <i>VI Mostra Internazionale di Grafica</i> in Ljubljana.
1966	Flies to London to work for six months, where he meets Richard Lin and presents a solo exhibition at Signals Gallery, London. Presents solo exhibitions at Il Canale Gallery (Galleria Il Canale), Venice and Falazik Gallery (Galerie Falazik), Bochum. Participates in <i>Musische Geometrie</i> at Arts Society of Hannover (Kunstverein Hannover), Hannover.
1967	Visits New York for the first time and lives there until 1972. His daughter, Samantha, is born in New York in October. Presents solo exhibitions at T. Brechbuhl Gallery (Galerie T. Brechbühl), Grenchen, Wirth Gallery (Galerie Wirth), Berlin, Marconi Studio (Studio Marconi), Milan, and Rose Fried Gallery, New York, which is the first gallery in US presenting geometric abstraction at that time.

1970	Presents solo exhibitions at Orez Gallery (Galerie Orez), The Hague, Fonke Gallery (Galerie Fonke), Gent, Marconi Studio (Studio Marconi), Milan, and Sant'Andrea Gallery (Galleria Sant'Andrea), Milan. Participates in <i>III Salon International de Galeries Pilotes</i> in Lausanne and Paris.

1980	Marks his first return to China after thirty-one years; participates in memorials in Beijing and Shanghai respectively for commemorating the 40th anniversary of death of his father Hsiao Yumei, and gives a talk on Twentieth-Century Western art in the Red Flag Hall of the Ministry of Culture in Beijing which is well attended. Presents solo exhibitions at Ideogram Gallery (Galleria Ideogramma), Turin and Printmakers Art Gallery, Taipei. The latter is titled <i>HSIAO CHIN Exhibition</i> . Participates in <i>Contemporary International Original Prints Exhibition</i> in Taipei.

Marking a turning point in his artistic career, he has a profound sentimental experience with Ch'an philosophy and embarks on a brand-new phase of his artistic development with the iconic series of the same name. Paints with vibrant colours with colourful speckles, which appear in his works since 1985 and become a consistent symbol throughout his creation from 1985 to 1995.
